Science Olympiad Student Competes at WMU

Vicksburg Middle School 8th grader, Abigail Harp, participated in the Region 10 Middle School Science Olympiad tournament at Western Michigan University on March 15.

Science Olympiad is an international non-profit organization devoted to improving the quality of science education. The competitions are like academic track meets consisting of a series of team events.

Abigail competed in the Anatomy and Physiology event. Out of the Top 8 schools to qualify for the Road Scholar award, Vicksburg Middle School finished in 2nd place behind Portage West Middle.

CTE Student Earns Second Place in State

Congratulations to Emily West, CTE Veterinary Science student from Vicksburg High School, on her FFA State Silver award for her original agriscience research project!

Emily investigated the effects of supplementing vitamin B12 in Pygmy goats. She wrote a professional research paper, and presented her research to the state qualifying committee via video.

As a State Qualifier in the Animal Systems division, she created a

scientific research poster and presented her project live to the state judges at Michigan State University. This was a very demanding project and Emily exceeded her goal in earning second in the state for her research!
