
Ethan plans to attend the University Notre Dame University to major in mechanical engineering on a premedicine track

Middle School Track Team Breaks Records

At the first middle school track meet of the season, 3 Vicksburg Middle School records were broken! And the very next week the team broke 3 more!

At the very first competition the following records were set:

High Jump: Greyson Buikema (8th grade) broke the 5'5 record by PRing at 5'8.

Boys 4x100 Relay: Tanner

Counsil, Ja'Kobi Reed, Austin Shaw and Andres Flores (all 8th grade) broke the 49.64 record by PRing with a 47.88.

Boys 4x200 Relay: Ja'Kobi Reed, Andres Flores, Tanner Counsil and Greyson Buikema (all 8th grade) broke the 1:43.27 record by PRing with a 1:40.07.

Meanwhile, the next week the team did it again! They re-broke 2 records and set a new one!

Boys 4x100 Relay: Tanner Counsil, Andres Flores, Evan Wilcox-Noble and Ja'Kobi Reed broke their own 47.88 record by PRing with a time of 47.29

Boys 4x200 Relay: Tanner Counsil, Greyson Buikema, Ja'Kobi Reed and Andres Flores broke their own 1:40.07 record by PRing with a time of 1:39.96

While the Boys 4x400 Relay: Evan Wilcox-Noble, Ben Roiniotis,

Micah Hostetler and Andres Flores broke the 4:01.94 record (2023) by PRing with a time of 3:59.22

With all the records, and other great showings, a total of 20 middle school athletes have qualified to compete at the State meet!

Coach Knapp's number 17 jersey was also retired and VCS officials unveiled a new tribute to him.


They hope to make the memorial tournament a yearly event.
